For over fifteen years, he has been committed to promoting a culture of peace, intercultural dialogue, and social justice through art, critical education, and historical memory.

As an activist, he works to raise the profile of Latin American indigenous peoples, promoting their narratives, aesthetics, and ethical resistance.

## Tihomir PLEŠA Croatia

He is a teacher at the Osijek Vojakovački Rural School, an annex of the OŠ Ljudevita Modeca Primary School in Križevci, Croatia.

For over 30 years, he has taught at this small school, which currently accommodates only seven students across four grades, in a deeply family-oriented and supportive environment.

His commitment to education is evident both in his consistency and in the human quality of his support for generations of children.

Despite difficult beginnings, he chose to remain in a demanding environment, becoming a leading educational figure in his region.

In 2023, he received the prestigious national “Ivan Filipović” award for his distinguished career in primary education.

Since 2015, Tihomir PLEŠA has been actively involved in the Living Peace International project, promoting a culture of peace, inclusion, and cooperation within his school community.

In 2016, his school officially joined this international educational network. In 2017, he led a workshop entitled “Cooperation” at the Living Peace World Congress in Castel Gandolfo, helping to spread the values of peace worldwide.



## Katiuscia Carna Italy

She authentically embodies the fundamental values of peace, fraternity, and selfless service. With great humility, she always works behind the scenes, without seeking recognition, but with a deep sense of responsibility and a sincere love for humanity.

She is distinguished by: her constant loyalty to the educational mission of peace, her ability to create bonds of trust between very diverse people and cultures, her generous availability, even beyond her professional obligations, and a profound spirituality that nourishes her daily work.

### International Reach

Although her mission is largely carried out behind the secretariat's back, her impact is tangible on a global scale. She has contributed to the realization of several international forums, campaigns, and projects (particularly in connection with the International Days of Peace, Children's Day, and Youth Peace Forums), promoting exchange and the active participation of young people and educators from all continents.

She also carries a vision: that of a united world, woven by words, encounters, poetry and commitment.

She believes that every gesture, every word, every smile can become a "seed of peace".



## Maria Do Carmo Brazil

She promotes the peace education project through theater using the De' for Peace and Pepê and Jtabe, at the Centro Pop de Taguatinga/Federal District, which helps people in vulnerable situations. "I have participated as a guest in various activities to discuss peace, for example: the ecumenical event "Ecumenical Dialogue: Citizen Experience in Peace building," the 10th Symposium: Human Rights and Religious Diversity in reference to the International Day of Peace.

When I was invited to participate in the roundtable, I spoke to them about the De' for Peace; I participated in the 2nd Panel on the Culture of Coexistence organized by the Intercultural Institute and the Islamic Center for Interreligious Dialogue, in partnership with the GCUB and CONIC, with the aim of reflecting on the power of intercultural and interreligious dialogue in building a more harmonious society.

I am contributing to the organization of the 1st Congress of the Education for Peace team: The Art of Loving, whose theme is: The Art of Loving in Building Fraternity and Peace; I intuitively negotiated the partnership between the Education for Peace team: The Art of Loving and the Sophia Institute so that it could compose its teaching staff to contribute to the peace education course that it would give in 2025, including its bibliographical material; the book series: Education for Peace: The Art of Loving is now part of the Sophia Institute library.



## Carlos Palma, Uruguay

As General Coordinator of Living Peace, Carlos founded a peace education project involving 2,750 schools and associations in 136 countries.

This initiative, in collaboration with 120 international peace organizations, creates and implements peace projects at the local and global levels.

He also coordinates the Living Peace World Youth Conference for Peace, which offers young people the opportunity to engage in peace building efforts, contribute to a more harmonious world, and become youth ambassadors for the CUAP France/Switzerland.

Currently, Living Peace International has built a network of 3 million students of all ages, as well as teachers and trainers in various academic, artistic, athletic, and professional fields, from diverse cultures and religions.

## Herlinda Loaiza, Peru

It is a great pleasure for me to share with you some of the social work I have been doing for many years. With my own savings, and sometimes thanks to the support of my family and friends, I travel to Andean communities in my native region of Cusco.

A few Christmases ago, I distributed hot chocolate, toys, and clothing in a village called San José de Urco.

I helped the residents obtain their land titles and single-handedly created a library in a small rural school, transporting all my books to this nearly isolated community. I also created a library in a school in a village near Paucartambo, in Cusco. And many other projects, such as the creation of a Community Education Center (CEO) in a village called Huanca, two hours from Arequipa, which I equipped with computers, sewing machines, and knitting machines, with the help of friends from Rotary

. I have traveled extensively, giving painting classes and lectures on household management and the self-care a woman should provide. Beyond my achievements as a visual artist, singer, musician, and writer, I always apply these principles in my daily life, within my family and social circles.
