Holy Land Trust Team Palestine

Dear Friends and Partners,

From the heart of Bethlehem, we write to you during a time of profound distress and urgent need. In these recent days, the Holy Land has been engulfed in a deepening crisis. Across Gaza, the West Bank, and now the wider region, violence has escalated beyond comprehension. Sirens echo, explosions continue, and hope grows fragile under the weight of unending war.

In Gaza, the devastation is overwhelming. Months of continuous bombardment have left tens of thousands dead, injured, or missing. Entire families have been erased. Hospitals are collapsing, homes are rubble, and basic necessities—water, electricity, food—have become rare luxuries. Civilians are not collateral damage; they are the primary victims. What we are witnessing is not only a humanitarian catastrophe—it is the ongoing destruction of a people and a land that cries out for justice.

In the West Bank, life is being strangled under closures, military checkpoints, and restrictions on movement. Towns and villages are cut off from one another. Families are trapped, students cannot reach their universities, and aid is delayed or denied. Perhaps most critically, Israel's increasing control over the border crossing between the West Bank and Jordan (Allenby Bridge) has created a crisis of isolation. Thousands of Palestinians are now stranded—some unable to leave for urgent medical care or family reunification, others stuck abroad, unable to return home. The right to move freely—to live, to connect, to simply exist—has been turned into a weapon.

Chaotic scenes at the King Hussein Bridge Border Crossing between Jordan and the occupied West bank, with thousands of people trying to get in and out of Palestine (16.06.2025).

These blockades and assaults are not only disrupting daily life—they are obstructing our mission for healing and peace. Holy Land Trust's Executive Director, was set to join an international interfaith delegation with Earth Caravan, carrying the Flame of Hope from Hiroshima to the Vatican. The purpose: to receive a blessing from Pope Leo XIV and bring this flame back to Bethlehem as a symbol of light, unity, and our shared commitment to peace in a wounded world. That vision has been delayed—though not extinguished—by the very forces we seek to transform.

Our Path Is Different

At Holy Land Trust, we have always chosen a different path.

We believe in the power of no violence.

We believe in healing collective trauma.

And we believe that even in the darkest of times, hope can still be planted.

We call upon the United Nations, international human rights organizations, governments, faith communities, and people of conscience around the world to take immediate and courageous action. We urge you to demand a complete and immediate ceasefire, to protect all civilian lives in Gaza, the West Bank, and across the region, and to insist on a political process that leads to a just and lasting peace, grounded in international law and human dignity. We also ask for your support in helping our people heal—through trauma-informed care, community resilience, and sustained nonviolent engagement.

The Holy Land was never meant to be divided by walls, checkpoints, and fear. It is sacred not because of ownership, but because of its call to shared Humanity. The memory of our pain—Jewish, Christian, Muslim—must not be used to justify new harm. It must become a source of awakening, transformation, and reconciliation.

This moment demands truth.

Peace Activist

It is with great pleasure that I write to you to share with you everything I have been able to share with you about my commitment to carry out throughout 2025. Cardinal Carlos Aguiar, of the Primate Archdiocese of Mexico, has appointed me for three years as advisor to the Commission for Ecumenism and Interreligious Dialogue. In this area of dialogue,

I continue to promote the "Virtual Visit between Communities" month after month, with the aim of promoting mutual understanding to overcome reluctance and mistrust, and to generate a climate of esteem that can give way to shared commitments to peace.

In January, I participated in the moment of prayer for Christian unity held at the Pontifical University of Mexico and in the fraternal dialogue that followed between leaders of various Christian denominations. For the month dedicated to honoring the efforts of women around the world to achieve greater justice and inclusion, we are dedicating the virtual tour to a panel of testimonies from several Latin American countries under the theme "Women Builders of Hope, Dialogue, and Peace."

Month after month, I participate online in the Argentine "Shared Readings" initiative, in which, with the help of a Jewish rabbi and a Christian theologian, we approach the sacred texts of the First and Second Testaments.

Over time, we have built a genuine interreligious community characterized by dialogue. During the summer months, I promoted the "Umbrellas for Peace" initiative among the new generations: a small group of children from the School of Peace of the Community of Sant'Egidio, young women from the Focolare Movement, a group of adolescents and young people from the Anglican Church painted beautiful umbrellas for peace, which we were able to hand over to the leaders of various traditions who participated on September 20 in the interreligious activity of the Season of Creation, which we are organizing for the third consecutive year in synergy with the Integral Ecology Commission and the Laudato Si Movement.

More than 50 people from various religious traditions were present, including His Grace Hesiquios de Makianis, Auxiliary Bishop of the Holy Archdiocese of the Greek Orthodox Church with a deacon, Bishop Sally Sue Hernández and Bishop Ramón A. Gutiérrez of the Anglican Church, as well as leaders and lay people from the German-speaking Lutheran Church, the Mexican Communion of Reformed Churches and Presbyterians, the Agape Faith Community, the Evangelical Covenant Church, and the Sokka Gakkai introduced Buddhism and the Nur Ashki Jerrahi Sufi Order to Islam.

The active, knowledgeable, and committed participation of the young people was remarkable. Two young women presented Pope Francis's reflections on integral ecology and the challenge textile waste poses to the world. They invited those present to join, from each table, in a joint effort: words were to be painted on strips of fabric recovered from clothing that would otherwise have become waste.

This was an opportunity for creativity in which everyone could make their unique and original contribution. In a second moment, the strips of fabric were joined together, with generous stitches that seemed to reflect each of us's desire to weave networks and synergies among ourselves, until we discovered, in the blanket that contained each of our paintings, a phrase that embodies the hope of this Season of Creation 2025: "Creation will find peace when justice is restored."
